April Head of the River Race Dartmouth to Totnes

I was inspired to join in with the rowers and paddle boarders after a random chat with a few of them a few weeks earlier. The route alternates each year, of 15Km and this year started just above the higher car ferry.

I'd decided to take on the paddle boarders, some of whom were categorised as semi pro, and on 15ft £1-2K boards. On the day there was a F4 breeze coming down the Dart, even though we had the tide with us.

Some might say its incompetence, but I misread the start times and the paddle boarders (150 in total) started around 1.30. I was launched and ready in my ancient Fibreglass white water racer which wobbles unless you're moving at 3.15. The rowers in their 4, 2, and single man river, sea, and gig boats were departing. So without further ado I set off, having to avoid the racing line as the stream of overtaking boats with rowers aged from 16 to 70 overtook me, some going like the clappers, others in a more laboured way. The headwind rounding the Greenway ferry jetty was unhelpful, as I deliberated on pausing for refreshments from Dittisham's inviting Ferryboat pub. However, Steve Redgrave didn't get his five golds by this approach, so I carried on.

I was able to slice some of the corner after Dittisham to the long straight toward Stoke Gabriel and Bow Creek. It was here that the wind really meant more effort

needed and the spray was coating my face and glasses. The mixed pairs, and single sculls, were over taking and what a miserable bunch of grimacing rowers they were. I even witnessed some 'gamesmanship' with weaving to disrupt overtaking rivals.

Rounding Duncannon Bend it got easier, although I overcooked it, and the shallows really slowed me down with the drag, a mistake I made again coming up to Sharpham and the river fronted cottage. I did exchange pleasantries with a young female rowing pair, who seemed to be lacking a bit of fitness.

My confidence was up, I knew it was only about 20 minutes to the finish so I rounded the corners, and passed Sharpham quay knowing that I was almost there. At last I sighted some slow paddle boarders about 300m from the rowing club finish, they were no match for my speed and desire to beat them. On reflection, they weren't very good, and perhaps I should have offered them a tow.

At the line a toot from the finishing team, job done. Approx: 1'30. The lead boarders took 1'25. I would have come 91st out of the rowers, I think that it would be closer if the boarders had been in sight, and with other PCC members for team work battling the headwind.

I found plenty of food and drink in the club house afterwards, before it was time to walk home with Kayak on my shoulder.

Let's line up a team for next year!

6 Goodrington - Meet at Youngs Park Road

- 13 Goodrington - Meet at Youngs Park Road
- 20 Paddle the Dart from Totnes - Meet at Longmarsh car park. Head downstream & return with the tide. (Ideal for canoes!)
- 27 Teign Estuary, Passage House to Teignmouth - Meet at Polly Steps car park, Drive through Teignmouth docks, to run shuttle up to the Passage House. (Ideal for canoes!)

June

- 3 Kingswear to Brixham – Meet at 6.30pm at Darthaven marina car park to organise shuttle to Brixham. A Long and committing 9 mile paddle! Bring a drink, snacks and a light for a late finish in the dark. (For long kayaks only!)
- 10 BBQ at Silver Cove – Meet at Youngs Park Road, paddle to Silver Cove for a BBQ. Bring your cooking gear, food & drinks (No pedestrian access)
- 17 Babbacombe to Coombe Cellars - Meet at Babbacombe 6.30pm to run shuttle, late finish.
- 24 Preston to Torquay or further? And return - Meet to launch near Slipway on Marine Parade

July

- 1 Rescue practice Goodrington - Meet at Youngs Park Road for an evening of sea rescues. Dress to get wet!
- 8 Paddle the Exe Canal or Exe down the weirs and return – Meet at Haven Banks car park. Helmets required if going down the weirs.
- 15 Stoke Gabriel to Bow Creek & Watermans Arms, return 10.30 in the dark, bring lights.
- 22 Meadfoot to Thatchers Rock & the Orestone
- 29 Cockwood to Turf Lock and return, longish paddle ending in the dark.
