New Club Kit

Yep more new kit!!! The little stuff: 4 new Buoyancy aids, 2 Neoprene spraydecks and some airbags. Reminder **course kit is in the red bags** all **other kit in blue bags**. The big stuff: Pyranha Fusion and a Big Dog force.

Pyranha Fusion: Large blue and white. This is a stable general purpose boat that is also ideal for touring and longer trips, it has a skeg and a sealed in compartment with a hatch in the aft section like a sea kayak. It is ideal for larger paddlers but can be used by smaller ones if needed. It is not ideal for white water but would be ok on easy higher level trips (with very few rocks|). See it here

Big Dog Force 8.0: Yellow. A stable solid creek boat, great for general purpose use, polo and all levels of river running white water, you will find it a bit sluggish on the longer flat trips though. Yes it was Nathan's old boat, so thanks to Nathan for selling it to us. See it here

Facebook, Forum, Ipad Link Issues

The app doesn't like links to web pages that require a log in. Work arounds include: copy/pasting the link into your browser; setting the forum as favorite for quick access and access it that way and using the browser (safari) rather than the app.

Lower Dart River Clean

There's a Facebook page called Kayaking the River Dart & one of the main posters & admin behind the page is Mark Allen. As part of a number of river clean ups, including the Upper Dart, Erme, Tavy & Teign, we were asked if we could do something. The decision was made to do the Lower Dart from Buckfastleigh down to Staverton.

Jon Roberts was the main co coordinator for our efforts on the day. While he was up at the River Dart Country Park collecting bin bags & gloves provided by the

Environment Agency, our paddlers met at Buckfastleigh lay by. To say it was busy on the river was an understatement with recent rainfall allowing various groups the opportunity to run their club events. Anyway, while shuttles were run, the lay-bys were cleaned by the awaiting paddlers. Obviously being by the road there was a lot of litter.

Our group of 17 paddlers on the water certainly was impressive with a very wide range of experience & the chance to help with skills training on the way down wasn't missed. Well done to our newer WW paddlers & thanks to the experienced paddlers for their help & patience.

Once on the water, the opportunity to stop in eddies, hop out & clean the river banks meant slow progress down the river but a thorough job was done. Many plastic bottles & polythene items were found along the way. Below the main rapid that can be seen from the road we were joined by some extra bank support, Harriet with Reu & Tilda providing addition help and cake while we stopped for a short break.

Back on the water as bags were filled, the rubbish was stacked in the two canoes. These being paddled by Tim (solo) & Sam K with Jo Lihou (tandem) started off looking quite normal but soon the extra weight made them paddle very low in the water. Tim's boat was soon sporting two plastic chimneys & a crutch sticking up, all reclaimed from the river. Metalwork, chairs, wire & lots of junk were found along with water pistols & balls. Heavily loaded by Staverton the canoes were hard to manage thru the rapids but all went well.

Unloading took time & the pile on the roadside was huge. Thankfully we had been joined by a paddler from up near London who had a van so that got loaded & driven up to the RDCP for disposal. While everyone got changed, more superb cake was demolished (big thanks to Harriet) before some of us headed up for a beer at the park. I reckon we probably returned with the most rubbish but at least that means less to pick up next year!
